Mikoyan-Gurevich Mig 23 "Flogger"

At Air Venture in Oshkosh in 2023, a rare warbird was sitting on the tarmac that has never been there before. An aircraft with swept wings and a Russian insignia stood out prominently among the different planes. The plane was a Russian made Mig-23 and it's owned by Lieutenant Commander Dan "Files," Filer. Dan was an A-6 Intruder pilot in during the Gulf War and has a passion for the restoration of Soviet aircraft such as the Mig. His Mig-23 is the only privately owned aircraft of its type to date. He owns three of these Migs.

A brief history about the Mig-23 starts in 1967 when it made its maiden flight. The production of the aircraft began in 1969 and over 5000 of them were constructed. Several different countries used the Mig-23 for their defenses. These countries included Germany, Hungary, India, Iran, Iraq, Libya, etc. The Mig-23 was upgraded to the Mig-27 with the same Flogger nickname and improved radar, electronics and performance.

One of the distinct features of the Mig-23 is its swept wing design. The variable geometry wing allows the pilot to change the signature of the aircraft. The wings are extended straight for slower flight and for supersonic speeds the wings are folded into a swept pattern.

• Blue Angels cookie fundraiser:


