"Our Bright Future" ROTC Milwaukee Det 930 visit to the CAF Wisconsin Wing

A big **THANK YOU** to Elaine Kroening, Sue & Dave Cook for coordinating and the connection to meet the cadets from **ROTC Milwaukee Det 930** which was est in 1998. Elaine's niece, C/Lt Col Cassie L Herda is a senior at Marquette University and in the ROTC program. She will be graduating in May and *commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Air Force*. A good number of the cadets are training to be pilots and have a huge interest in warbirds. In addition, a few were also history buffs. Elaine thought it would be a great education for these cadets to come out to visit the Wisconsin Wing for a tour, Q&A and make connections and so she reached out to Sue & Dave.

We asked C/Lt Col Herda to tell us about the ROTC program:

"We have 41 cadets. Requirements to join are pretty simple: must pass a Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board (DODMERB) medical exam, be in good physical shape, conform to the weight and fitness standards as established by the U.S. Air Force and Space Force, and have the drive to put in the effort. Staying in the program depends if you're on scholarship or not. Scholarship cadets need to have a GPA above 2.5 and pass the Air Force Physical Fitness Assessment each semester. If not, the GPA is 2.0 and it is not a requirement to pass the PFA until after you've contracted. Cadets contract after they pass Field Training which typically takes place between Sophomore and Junior year. As well cadets need to respect military customs and have qualities befitting a leader and officer."



New Wisconsin Wing T-34 Pilot - Thanks to Coyote Squadron by Col John Reed

My background is US Air Force (T-41, T-37, T-38, C-130, C-141, C-17), American Airlines Pilot (MD-80, B757, B767, B737), and General Aviation Pilot (C-172, J3 Cub, Citabria, RV4, TRF1, PA44, T-34A/B).

I started flying T-34s in California about 12 years ago at the March AFB Aero Club where we had five T-34s (2 B-models and 3 A-models). We also had an active formation training and flying program mostly doing missing man formations for funerals at the nearby Riverside National Cemetery but also flyovers for holiday parades, memorials, sports events, retirements, change of commands, and occasionally an airshow.

In early 2020, I had just moved to Wisconsin and was looking for a venue to continue flying T-34s. Being a member of the T-34 Association, I was aware that the CAF Wisconsin Wing had a T-34 and I contacted Gary Otto, Mike Woods and Steve Lark to inquire about what it would take to be one of their T-34 pilots. They gave me some information about the process of joining CAF, the Wisconsin Wing, and then becoming a Pilot Sponsor for the T-34. I was immediately interested, but couldn't follow through until April of 2022.

Gary and Mike got me signed up for National CAF, Wisconsin Wing membership, and scheduled for a Flight Evaluation Board so that the Wisconsin Wing Pilots could review my qualifications and interview me as a potential T-34 Sponsor Pilot. After getting approved by the FEB, paperwork (CAF Form 600 – Transition Letter) was submitted to CAF HQ to start my training. At that point, I dove into the online ground training requirements (CRM, 60-1, T-34 Ground School, etc) to get them completed before starting the flight training.

Our initial attempt to get myself and some of the other new T-34 Sponsor Pilots trained hit a snag when our local T-34 Instructor Check Pilot was unavailable to do our training. A plan was made to have Dan Summerall come up from Texas in June to spend a week getting us all trained. Part of that plan was to also have me checkout as CAF Instructor Check Pilot to be the Wisconsin Wing's new T-34 Check Pilot so that we wouldn't have to fly Check Pilots in to conduct training in the future. That plan hit a snag when N5347W, our T-34, was found to have some engine corrosion issues that needed to be resolved. Estimated completion of engine maintenance was December at the earliest.

Next attempt to get training was a plan for me to fly down to do my T-34 checkout with Dan Summerall at the CAF Coyote Squadron in Corsicana, TX, in July. This attempt was derailed by a brake issue with N802HV, the Coyote Squadron's T-34, just days before our planned training.

After hearing the brake issue was resolved, Dan and I coordinated to get together at the Coyote Squadron for a few days of training in mid-November. The plan worked out this time and Dan saw that I could meet standards in both the front seat and as an instructor in the back seat. We completed Form 602 paperwork and got it submitted for HQ approval. An approval letter from HQ to fly the T-34 was sent to me before I even got home to Wisconsin. Mission accomplished!

So now we're ready to get N5347W back flying as soon as the engine work is done. Then we can get annual checks done for the current T-34 Sponsor Pilots and get the new T-34 Sponsor Pilots checked out to fly also.

In the spring, it would be nice to take the T-34 to some formation clinics and get some formation training for the Wisconsin Wing T-34 Pilots. Of course, T-6s are also welcome at the clinics. 2023 is shaping up to be a fun year to fly the Wisconsin Wing T-34!

I would like to thank the Commemorative Air Force and the Wisconsin Wing for allowing me to get back in the pilot seat of a T-34. Special thanks to Dan Summerall and the Coyote Squadron for helping to get my CAF T-34 Pilot training done.

Greetings from Texas! by Col Dan Summerall

As some of you know, I am a member of the WI Wing but reside in Texas as a member of the Coyote Squadron. Our two groups are very similar as we both have a T-34 and a PT. In our case it is a PT-19, but effectively the same aircraft. I am an instructor pilot for the T-34 and gave Colonel Gary Otto his initial check out for your T-34 in 2020.

We have been trying to get training done for Colonel John Reed for many, many months. I was set to come to Wisconsin to do the training months ago when the initial discovery was made of the problems with the T-34 engine. I had to cancel that flight and wait to see what was in store for us in the future. We have tried to schedule several times for John to come to Texas but things never aligned for us to get a convenient time for both of us when our T-34 was "up". Finally, we were able to agree on a time and our aircraft cooperated.

John arrived on the Monday following Wings Over Dallas and we met at our hangar for some hands-on hangar flying that afternoon. Next day we briefed and John flew his first of two flights to qualify him as a T-34 Instructor/Check Pilot. It was immediately apparent that John was going to do a good job as he was already proficient with taxiing an aircraft with no steerable nose wheel steering. It's a difficult thing to master and he was already there! We went out and did some high work to get him familiar with the aircraft and how it handled. That complete, we returned to the pattern for landing practice. Again, John did an excellent job. We did a full stop landing, did a debrief and got ready for his flight from the back seat. After I started the engine (you can't do that from the back seat), John was in full control of the aircraft. We repeated the flight from the morning with him doing the entire flight from the back seat. We returned to the field and again he did a wonderful job in the landing pattern. We taxied in and put the aircraft away then finished with submitting his paperwork to headquarters. John had done an excellent job all around and I was happy to sign him off as a T-34 Instructor/Check Pilot!

I write this to acknowledge what a great asset John Reed will be for the Wisconsin Wing. I look forward to hearing good things going forward.

Members should have received an email from HQ on Oct. 25th notifying us of the changes, but in case you missed it, the new dues are as follows:

Maintenance Report – December 2022 by Col Steven Sorge – Maintenance Officer – WI Wing

T-34

- Plane Safe has submitted final quote for engine overhaul and installation
- – estimated to be \$53223.18. This includes \$13,500.00 for new crankshaft assembly, and Exhaust system repair/rebuild: \$3900.00. Awaiting funding
- analysis and approval to proceed with this work.



PT-26

- Regarding Gear – Legs were sandblast cleaned and sent to NDT specialties in Oak Creek for Magnetic Particle inspection: Minor cracks in lower gussets were detected in Right gear leg...appears not to be repairable. Looking at the next pair of legs we acquired for testing.
- Bushings for Tailwheel assembly have been ordered by PT mechanic. Tailwheel repairs should be next to be completed.
- We are still seeking 2 cylinders that can be sent out for rebuild so we can get the engine going again.
- Will need to complete another annual inspection before returning to the sky.

SNJ-5

- Aircraft repositioned to Tabair on Monday 11/28/2022 for annual.
 - Squawks; compass dry, new oil cap needed (cap supplied) , rubber wear strip on LH wing seam cover is loose. Oil change due in 6 hrs.
- Revised Request for New Com Radio Quote for was sent in November, no response yet. Shop did comment that Garmin is @ 6 months out on delivery.
