Speaker: Will 'Psycho' Ward – "Mig-23 & Mig-25 Myths"

As membership officer, I'm always on the lookout for neat stories and information for our members, and our guest presentation for February should certainly fit that bill! Most of us recall the cold war mystique of various Eastern Bloc fighters, whose capabilities were shrouded in mystery and very existence proven only by grainy black and white photos. With the fall of the Soviet Union and recent declassification of the operations of the 4477th 'Red Eagles' that secretly tested MiGs out of Groom Lake and Tonopah, it became widely 'known' that these aircraft weren't any good at all.

"Au contraire" says our guest speaker, as he has the research, knowledge, and experience to put some luster back on the reputation of the Flogger and Foxbat. Will 'Psycho' Ward is an ATP with over 14,000 hours and has flown over 80 different aircraft. He has owned and operated several different MiGs, the most recent being a MiG-23ML (Flogger-G) that he's working on returning to the airshow circuit. Maintenance Report - February 2024: by Col Scott Twesme – WI Wing Maintenance Officer

SNJ:

Radio replacement - no numbers yet, but up for discussion on what we may want. Spoke with Dave at Avionics place in Rockford a few times, but he hasn't responded yet with any kind of install numbers.

W/B paperwork is done and Excel W/B calculator is updated. Right now, depending on pilot/parachute weight, we can put roughly a 250lb passenger in the back seat with full fuel and minimal baggage. We are under the max weight, but bump up against the aft CG limit. If we remove the ballast, we can get the max passenger weight closer to 290, again with the CG being the limit.

T-34:

Flying, with no new reported issues. Annual is scheduled for 19 Feb.. Plane Safe can hopefully clean up some of the mx issues at that time, but some are more important than others. Until we get a good handle on how much MX money is available for misc repairs we're holding off on non-critical items. Items that need to be addressed are re-tightening the wing spar ALEC, left gear up indication, and adjust gear warning horn.


Change of Command at the 128 ARW..... by Col Dave Cook



This past fall the Wisconsin Wing had the opportunity to tour the 128th Air Refueling Wing in Milwaukee. The tour was given by none other than Col Charles Merkel who had recently transferred from the 115 FW in Madison and had given us a tour of that facility the previous year. On Saturday, February 3, 2024, Col Merkel was officially installed as the new commander of the 128 ARW during a Change of Command ceremony as he replaced Col Adria Zuccaro as the outgoing commander.

Col Merkel spoke about the challenges that lay ahead for the 128 ARW. The rapid growth of the Chinese military was first and foremost in their concerns. Currently flying the 60+ year old KC-135 tankers, the 128 ARW has just been approved to enter the competition for new KC-46 tankers. Community support for the effort to bring the new aircraft to Milwaukee will be critical to this effort.

Two of our Wing members, Candy Parr and Dave Cook, are also members of the 128 ARW Community Council and had the honor of attending the impressive Change of Command ceremony at the 128 ARW. As part of the event, the 115th Fighter Wing in Madison flew in two F-35 fighters that were available for inspection after the ceremony. All of us at the Wisconsin













Education Update by Col Tom Leunig – WI Wing Education Officer

On January 10, 2024, COL Candy Parr and I attended the Waukesha County Airport Youth in Aviation Task Force. The task force is chaired by Abby Lorenz, who is a member of the Waukesha County Airport Commission. COL Steve Betzler is also on this commission. The purpose of this task force is to get more SE Wisconsin youth involved with aviation. The goal is to make Waukesha the epicenter of youth aviation in SE Wisconsin.

Among the participants was the New Beginnings Aviation Ministry. This group is aimed at children and teens of color and headed up by Charles Allen, a former Air Force pilot and Gulf War veteran. He is also a retired family practice physician. They offer a free flight school. The New Beginnings Aviation Ministry was founded in 2007 by Pastor Jerome Spencer. Pastor Spencer passed away in 2014, but the aviation ministry has continued on with Charles Allen in charge.

Other participants include Girls Can Fly which sponsors a program at Hartford Airport. Also, participating are the WisDot Bureau of Aeronautics, and the local EAA Chapter. The Wisconsin Wing of the CAF will participate. Potential involvement might be some CAF member hanger tours, having our T-34 and/or SNJ on display for some events, and maybe offering some guest speakers. The next meeting is on Wednesday, February 7 at 11:30. I will attend and update everyone with more information as the task force develops.

On the flight home at the end of the day there will be a "mail call" where each veteran will be able to read letters and cards they receive. This is so special to the veteran, because they have no idea that letters will be received - - and they get to read them on their flight home!

Here is some information about the Badger Honor Flight program (out of Madison, WI) from their website:

Badger Honor Flight is a regional affiliate of the national Honor Flight Network. The purpose of the Honor Flight Network is to ensure that World War II, Korean War, Vietnam War and terminally ill Veterans from any war have the opportunity to see the memorials that have been erected in their honor. The Honor Flight Network provides all amenities to the veterans, including all transportation, meals and lodging. Everything is free to the veterans because of how much they have sacrificed for this great country already. The only money veterans need is if they want to buy a souvenir for themselves.

The veterans are accompanied by volunteer guardians. Guardians make sure the veterans stay with the group and take care of any special needs. Veterans are selected for flights on a first-come, first-served basis. Currently, all World War II Veterans are moved to the top of the waiting list, and then Korean Veterans. Exceptions are made for terminally ill Veterans from any conflict; if a doctor certifies that a veteran is terminally ill, he or she receives priority status. Approximately 85-90 Veterans go on each flight and there are five flights each year. Currently, the waiting list is over 1,100 Veterans. Thank you so much for considering writing a personal heartfelt letter to Chuck! It will serve as a special keepsake from his Honor Flight and bring him great joy.

Masters of the Air - Screening


For weeks after the big announcement last Fall that the long-awaited Hanks/Spielberg WWII production, Masters of the Air would launch on January 26th, many of us in the 100th Bomb Group organization waited on pins and needles to hear IF there would be any official 'Premieres' (parties!) planned. Yes, we soon heard, there would be!

Now, to hear if we will be invited. At last, we got the official invitation to the 'Boston Premiere', sent to us by 'APPLE+ TV' and the family of Harry Crosby, aka Croz, the navigator, and 'narrator' of the series.

Little did I ever imagine though, walking into the Coolidge Corner Theatre on the evening of January 26th, that I would be not only in the company of three hundred other WWII aficionados, but would also be 'seeing' so many of my WWII 8th Air Force buddies!

As a long-time member of the 8th Air Force Historical Society, I've had the great good fortune of knowing many, many fly boys from not only the 8th, but the 15th, the 9th and 12th Air Forces...traveling with, and talking to, and just sitting silently and listening to their stories and experiences, and missions, and jokes, and sadly as well, their life in a German POW camp. For some reason, we 'Boomers' have always been enthralled by these Fly

Boys; no matter where or when, we just wanted to 'be around them'. Some who never spoke a word about the war; some who would talk, but only to other veterans; but thankfully, some who did open up and TALK about 'their war'.

Over the years however, what these WWII veterans told us was just our imaginings; 'seeing' only in our mind's-eye what they saw with their real eyes. Now though, their 'war-in-the-sky' is in living-technicolor, up on the big screen.

Yes, Masters of the Air only zeroes-in on just one of the forty 8th Air Force Heavy Bombardment Groups in England, but the film tells-it-like-it-was for all Bomber Boys, true to what author Donald Miller so aptly put-to-paper. The sights, the sounds, the procedures, the rules, the regs, the briefing room with the huge maps of Fortress Europe, the who and what squadrons were where, in formation, the good times, the devastating times, the local Brits, the pubs, the relentless 24-hour-a-day hard work. Pretty much just like the Fly Boys always told us it was like.

Watching the first two episodes, I could 'see' my traveling-buddy Earl (8th 95th BG), lowering himself into the ball turret, getting ready for his 14th Mission in his beloved 'Ten Aces' Fortress. Little did Earl know they would be shot down over Munich on that very mission. Captured and sent to Stalag Luft IV until they were rousted in the Winter of '45, zig-zagged through Germany in the infamous Death March. While being used as 'pawns' by the Germans in a bid for a 'negotiated' end to the war, the vast majority of the POWs did not survive the march...Earl barely did.

As well, I could 'see' Tail-Gunner, Vince Parker (15th 301st BG) ... joking that he spent the war 'flying backwards'; and Larry Bachman, Dwight Olson, Junior Gossell mightily piloting these big bombers through thick and thin flak and dodging untold numbers of deadly ME109's; navigators Bob Clemens and Jim Rasmussen, nose-to-the-desk working the 'dead reconning computer', getting the big bomber to-target so bombardier Frank Frison could pull each 'n every tag and yell, 'bombs away', releasing the mission's 'best regards' to Hitler.



So many more Fly Boys, as well, who through the past decades TALKED to us Boomers...not because they thought we were 'special', by any means, but because the war was 3 decades in their past, and it was TIME. These vet's lives were a bit more 'relaxed' by then...surviving the war, going home, getting a job, marriage, mortgage, kids, grandkids, but now...it was time to think about it all and reflect, and thankfully, talk to us about 'their war'.

We will NEVER, EVER fully know and understand what these Fly Boys experienced in this, the most-deadly war in the history of the world...that goes without saying. However, through the lens of 21st Century technology and the talents and money of good people who believed the Bomber Boys' story HAD to told---the Masters of the Air series is giving us a 'flight' back-in-time---reaching 80 years ago, to 'see' on the screen what we could only 'see' in our mind's-eye for so long.

Yes, it's HOLLYWOOD...but it's close to 'reality' from what I've heard and learned from many, many flyboys over the years. After 'seeing' my Fly Boy buddies up on the screen, I again say to them wholeheartedly: THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE! Thank you for STEPPING FORWARD and taking-on and accomplishing the near-impossible, all the while simply saying, 'Well, I was just doing my job...what Uncle Sam asked me to do'!!

Thank you, dear Fly Boys for talking to us about 'your war'; we will never, ever forget what you've done for us.








Flight Crew Support...
