Maintenance Report - July 2023: by Col Scott Twesme - WI Wing Maintenance Officer

- T-34 → T-34 is flying well, still working with Plane Safe to get the gear warning horn adjusted properly. Intercom issues seem better. Ideally it would be nice to have an updated radio stack/ comm panel/ intercom.
- SNJ → SNJ is flying well after the carburetor rebuild. It's still burning too much fuel after install and will take a few more adjustments to get right, but it's not critical. One gear down indicator light in the rear cockpit is burned out, I'll have to get a bulb for that in the near future.

Operations Report - July 2023: by Col Mike Woods, CAF WI Wing Operations Officer

June was a good flying month as both planes are flying well. Both Scott Twesme and Gary Otto have been flying the SNJ and Mike Heileman, Jeff Karsten and Mike Woods have been flying the T-34.

John Reed has come up with a very detailed plan to keep track of all of our flying credentials and checkout procedures so both Gary and Mike will get back to him to either fine tune it or implement it.

The T34 has had a lot of radio issues, so both Nav/Coms were pulled out by Skycom and found to be defective. One of them is probably beyond economic repairs and the other one could be too. One of the Nav/Coms was replaced by a CAF spare radio and the other one is a loaner from Skycom, and they said they would give us a cost on a used KX155.

After test flights we found that noise cancelling headsets do not work well in the T-34, so David Clarks work best with a muff over the microphone. Also, the portable intercoms may be troublesome too so best to use the built in Interphone system, but that is not a perfect answer for non-pilot back seaters. Skycom said they could put a built in intercom but it would be Fall before they would have time. Cost about \$600 for the unit, but install cost is unknown now.

We are now waiting for Plane Safe to put in our dual manifold/fuel flow gauge, and we are still waiting to get the rest of our Mouse off of the tail.

John Reed has two more possible T-34 pilots to contact which I will do in a day or two.

LOOK OUT!

When opening or closing any hangar door make sure the safety latch is fully in the correct position and the door is free of any obstructions. It's always a good idea to give a verbal CLEAR prior to opening or closing hangar doors in case anyone is in the vicinity. Make sure any aircraft, tug, and/or equipment has plenty of clearance before operating.

When in doubt check twice!





This event was a fly-in pancake breakfast, car show, and EAA Young Eagles flights. Our SNJ was there on display and flown in by Gary Otto. There were also several other interesting liaison aircraft; a Piper L-4 Grasshopper and a Cessna 305A Bird Dog. We supported our friendly EAA Squadron 32 at this event.

WW-II Days ay Old Falls Village Park in Menomonee Falls:

This was a huge two-day event that honors WW-II veterans and includes mock battles; British, German, and American reenactor encampments; military vehicles, and vendors. I gave them a card and told them to have their parents call. Maybe we will recruit a couple more cadets.

After leaving West Bend, we flew back to Waukesha for Food Truck Friday. Steve and I showed the airplane to several adults and kids, and a couple of the adults showed interest in joining our wing.













Earliest Memories..... by Col Michael Guslick

One of my earliest memories is of Oshkosh, long before the days of 'AirVenture'. No, back then it was known as the "EAA Fly-In". Some may argue that the grass-roots event formed in those halcyon days are no longer what composes Oshkosh each summer. Oshkosh has changed and evolved, as have the rest of us. Many changes for the better, some perhaps more questionable. Yet I hope that Oshkosh never retreats from being an event where young memories are formed.

It was on a particular summer day that my grandfather (a USAAF cadet that went on to work on the B-32 Dominator) and uncles brought me to Oshkosh for the Fly-In. Mind you, being only 6 years old, my aviation interest was purely in jet fighters — anything with a prop was immediately rejected as undeserving of attention in my young mind, and getting dragged through the warbird section seemed boring and pointless when there were fast, pointy-nosed jets over in the main square! ("Can we go see the F-15 now? Pleeease?")

We were walking through countless rows of airplanes during the airshow, when from the south came a flight of old fighter planes in a Vic formation. Normally, this would not have interested me one bit (they had props, after all – ugh, so boring!), but in the #2 position was an F-14A Tomcat. As a result, this formation had my fullest attention. (Only decades later did I realize that I had been witness to a legendary 'Flight of the Grumman Cats'). After all, in the handful of airplane books I had, the F-14 was practically the peak of modern aviation, loaded with missiles, capable of incredible speeds, and able to defeat absolutely any adversary it was presented with. Any kid who had seen 'The Final Countdown' from the year prior knew that this airplane was the very definition of 'apex predator'.*

As the formation passed overhead, the F-14 lit the twin TF30 burners into full 'zone 5' reheat, swept its wings, and pulled up into the vertical. The sound was utterly unimaginable, reverberating all across the grounds, and it was the SINGLE MOST AWESOME THING I had ever witnessed in my life to that point.**

Yet meanwhile, my grandfather and uncles did not appear to share my unbridled excitement. There was a trumpet playing over the PA system – a sad, mournful melody that years later I would know as 'Taps'. My grandfather and uncles knelt down next to me and told me to remove my hat. They quietly explained to me that what I was seeing was called the 'missing man formation'. They briefly told me the history of this presentation, and its sanctity – a display of deepest reverence for fallen aviators. It was not a celebration, but a remembrance, with the splitting aircraft flying west towards the setting sun to honor those that did not return. I didn't understand it very well then, but I most certainly do now.

I recall this memory every time I go to Oshkosh. The warbird section is now always my first stop, and I remember the service of my grandfather and other now-gone relatives when I walk through the rows of proud aircraft and ponder their heritage. Some of those fast, pointy jets I loved as a kid (and still do) now reside there, too. While the F-14 is no longer flying and adding a proper roar to a 'Flight of the Grumman Cats' formation, the Heritage Flight teams have stepped up to provide the gravitas of heartfelt military aircraft displays of that caliber. When they fly overhead from behind the crowd for the final break pass, I'll give a glance around me at the people nearby — I'll hope that there's a 6-year old looking skyward with the same sense of awe and wonder as I did over 4 decades ago. Perhaps they'll get that same spark as well, and eventually become one who will steward these proud aircraft when the rest of us are gone.

*If you recall this classic film from before 'Top Gun' or 'Iron Eagle', or even if you don't, the air-to-air scenes are utterly phenomenal. VF-84 is on display in their most iconic livery, and the vast majority of flying is 100% real (with the 'Zeros' being flown by CAF pilots!) The one-line summary matches my own childhood recollection perfectly at any rate: "It was unforgettable." And indeed it was.
