### Executive Officer

Candidate: Col Tom McDermott

Tom McDermott has been a member of the Wisconsin Wing for 11+ years. He joined the unit just as the Wing had suffered the loss of the beautiful yellow PT. His 1st visit to the hanger was as the salvage aircraft returned to Waukesha.

In the following months, Tom noted that rather than pointing fingers, the Wing pulled together and grew stronger. He was not surprised to learn the SNJ was then assigned to the Wing. His enthusiasm is inspired by the service of his father in the 13th AA Corps who helped navigate B-25 Bombers across the vast waters of the Pacific.

Tom has assisted with Wing Staff Conferences', Midland AirSho, Coyote AirSho, Wings over Houston, Wings over Dallas and a little gathering known as the Oshkosh Fly-In / AirVenture. Tom was recognized by EAA this past summer for 40 continuous years of volunteering for EAA.

In addition to his home unit, he is a member of the Coyote Squadron, Central Texas Wing, Big Easy and Oil Crew. He enjoys close relationships with CAF members and sponsors various aircraft across the country.

His motivation to serve as Executive Officer is based on his desire to support the Wisconsin Wing to grow and care for the membership. Tom is supported in these activities by his wife, Mary Kay. *(She just wants him out of the house !!!)*

### Operations Officer

Candidate: Col Mike Woods

Mike Woods brings a wealth of experience and a strong history of volunteerism to the operations officer position. I would encourage more usage by more pilots, and I would also like to keep our pilots posted on upcoming currency requirements and potential aircraft issues."

- EAA - Young Eagles Pilot at Pioneer Airport with about 900 Young Eagles flown.
- Wisconsin Wing CAF - Operations Officer for four years.
- Currently on my second term on the Board of Directors serving as the Treasurer for our Condo Association in Florida.

Flying Qualifications: Private license issued in 1965, currently I have a Commercial license, with single engine land and sea, multi-engine, instrument and second in command Ford Tri-Motor ratings. Not current but have previously been a flight, instrument and multi-engine instructor. I have a Second Class Physical and fly our PT-26 and T-34, and I am a check pilot and rides pilot for our PT-26. Current total time is 3100 hours.

### Safety Officer

### Candidate #1: Col Chuck Christburg

Chuck is new to the CAF and the WI Wing this year, having recently retired from a long military and public service career. Chuck brings us a strong background in safety and is very qualified to carry out the responsibilities of the position. While assigned to a Marine Corps A-6E Intruder squadron, he served as one of the two safety officers. While the Aviation Safety Officer focuses on flight safety, Chuck was the senior accident board investigator for the squadron and Marine Corps, and he served as the Ground Safety Officer. The focus of his duties ranged from OSHA compliance in the work spaces, hazardous material storage to safety procedures regarding the movement and maintenance of aircraft, (i.e. ground related safety procedures). While assigned to a Marine Expeditionary Unit and Special Operations Training Group he was assigned as a safety officer. Chuck assisted in the establishing and monitoring of special operations live fire training events, safety procedures and emergency response planning groups in support of training incidents (e.g. live fire Hostage Rescue and Helicopter Raid events, etc.). While assigned to the USS Saratoga and USS Peleliu, he served as a Replenishment at Sea (RAS) safety officer. During RASs it is common for the ship to receive 200-400 sling loaded pallets to the flight deck over a 3-4 hour time period, while fork lifts and personnel simultaneously moved pallets and supplies to aircraft and ship elevators for storage.

### Safety Officer

### Candidate #2: Col Scott Twesme

Scott is relatively new to the CAF and the WI Wing, and brings us a strong background in safety and is very qualified to carry out the responsibilities of the position. Scott joined the Air Force in 1996 after graduating from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He flew the A-10 from 1998 to 2006 while on active duty, and continued to fly it until 2011 in the Reserve and ANG. He was qualified as an A-10, 4-ship flight lead, CSAR mission commander, instructor pilot, examiner, FAC(A), and FCF pilot with over 2000 hours of flight time. Scott's Safety background started in 2000, when he attended the 5-week Flight Safety officer training course at the Air Force Flight Safety School. He was the 75th FS safety officer, the 23rd FG flight safety officer, and deployed to Kuwait as the 9th AF flight safety officer during Operation Iraqi Freedom. While in Kuwait, he deployed to Tallil Air Base Iraq and oversaw the stand-up of a safety program there. Scott has also received CRM training from the start. Single-seat Cockpit Resource Management while flying the A-10, plus yearly traditional CRM training in his current airline job.

### Education Officer

### Candidate (incumbent): Col Jeanette Anderson

Originally from Pennsylvania, I have lived most of my life in Wisconsin. In 1997, I graduated from UW-Milwaukee with a degree in German and History. In my third year, I did an exchange semester at Justus Liebig University in Giessen, Germany. I also have a BA in Elementary Education from Lakeland College and a certification in Early Childhood Education from UW-Whitewater. I have been teaching for over 20 years, and currently teach kindergarten in Waukesha, where I live with my husband, Doug.

Other than commercial flights, my first experience with flying was a "Discovery Flight" at the Manitowoc Airport about 25 years ago. Back then, for about \$20, an instructor would take you up and show you a little about how to fly the airplane. It was an amazing experience that I have never forgotten. Recently, I had the privilege to fly on the EAA's B-17, Aluminum Overcast, and the CAF's That's All Brother. But the best ride of all was in our own SNJ. Getting to participate in these flight experiences really brings history alive in a way that no book can. As Education Officer, I hope to share the story of our aircraft to Educate, Inspire, and Honor.

### Lt Colonel John Anthony Palese Jr., USAF (ret) (September 3, 1955 - October 17, 2021)

Lieutenant Colonel John Anthony Palese, Jr. (ret.) passed away peacefully surrounded by his wife and four children on the morning of Sunday, October 17, 2021 at the age of 66.

He was the beloved husband of Angelina "Angie" (née Coles) and the loving father of Rachel (Patrick) Drayna, Christopher (Shannon), Catherine (Grant) Smith, and John III (Ashley). He was a dear

grandfather of Charles "Charlie" and William "Willie" Drayna, Kennedy Palese and Rose Palese. He was the cherished brother of Lisa (Paul) Leister, Sarah (Jeff) Thomson, Linda (Alan) Baker, and Luke (Enrique Useche-Andueza) Palese. He is also survived by many nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.

John spent his life serving his country and putting others first. He served in the United States Air Force, United States Air Force Reserve, Wisconsin Air National Guard (128th Aerial Refueling Wing), and in the Persian Gulf War.

John was an American Airlines Captain, Line Check Airman, and Federal Flight Deck Officer.

After retiring from American Airlines and the Wisconsin Air National Guard, he became a sworn Law Enforcement Officer in the state of Wisconsin (Washington County Sheriff's Office, Chenequa Police Department, Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office, Town of West Bend Police Department, and the Town of Hartford Police Department).



Throughout his professional career John served as an instructor in aviation (Carroll University and St. John's Northwestern Military Academy) and in law enforcement (Waukesha County Technical College and Northeast Wisconsin Technical College). He was also a personalized flight and ground instructor for the civilian aviation community. In the last several years, John provided strong leadership as the Chief Executive Officer of the Terra Vigilis Security Group.

John "Jay" will be remembered for his laughter, squinty smile, big personality, bear hugs, quick wit, polkas, pilot humor, morse code, and his amateur radio personality and voice. He was known for being a family man, caring brother, husband, dad, and grandpa. John's faith, service to others, and patriotism were steadfast as he always did what was right. Every time we look to the sky we know he is smiling down from Heaven. He will always keep watch over us from a higher altitude.
